In Tokyo, we were warmly welcomed by our Alliance missionary team. Our team's lead couple allowed us to live with them and provided all necessities there. We are delighted to connect with team members and get to know them and their ministry activities. We are grateful that we can have team fellowship there and appreciate their sharing and prayers.



Thanks to God, after arriving in Fukuoka, the local pastors and church members had prepared well for us to settle into our new environment. Only after five days in Fukuoka, we had our first Sunday service on 11/26, where Alan preached for the first time in Fukuoka. The welcomes from church members are very warm. With God's strength we are able to dive into ministry right away, including a visitation to a cancer patient on the same day we arrived. We are very thankful for the smooth transition.

1. Thank God for answering our prayers mentioned in our October Newsletter. Our time in China surpassed expectations, especially the meaningful reunion with Joan's siblings and their families. We gathered together to mourn the parents who passed away during the pandemic, rekindling connections that had grown distant due to the pandemic and the loss. Although none of Joan's siblings and family members have embraced faith yet, they willingly participated in memorial service in a Christ-centered manner and reflections. Subsequently, God also provided us with many timely opportunities to

share the gospel. During the stay, Joan's brother-in-law has expressed his openness to the Christian faith and showed the willingness to seek.

- 2. Thank God Alan had an opportunity to share a message at a wedding in China. The young couple used their wedding ceremony to sow the seeds of the Gospel. We witnessed the Gospel being shared to various people, even some business leaders. Romans 1:16: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile".
